Accessibility as an amplifier

- The level of accessibility acts as an amplifier or a silencer for a resource
- Accessibility is not profitable in a capitalist publishing landscape
- Inaccessibility as a series of barriers
- Ask your librarian about how accessible a resource is
- Ask about accessibility when you publish

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
