# **Your April Pay**

You may have noticed a reduction in your take-home pay in April. This is due to having to pay higher national insurance (NI) from April 2016.

Employees in a workplace pension have received a 1.4% NI rebate because they are contracted out from the additional state pension due to having their workplace pensions.

The basic state pension is not affected. From April we start paying the standard rate of NI; that for the vast majority of employees who are affected, this will mean you will be able to get more State Pension under the new scheme as a result of the changes compared to under the current scheme. # Trade Union Bill Government concession

The government has withdrawn plans to ban public service workers from having their union subs deducted from their wages.

The Cabinet Office minister confirmed that the government was withdrawing the plans to end check-off in the public sector and civil service. UNISON will continue to campaign against the other clauses in the bill.§
