Unison rejects pay offer

UNISON's higher education service group voted on 11th May to unanimously to reject the full and final pay offer made by UCEA, the national higher education employers' organisation.

UNISON national officer Ruth Levin, said: "The employers' offer of 1.1% for the vast majority of our members is a pittance. We know that the money is out there in universities and that they can afford to give their staff a decent and fair wage increase this year".

"Over the past five years our members' real term take home pay has plummeted. This year's offer doesn't keep up with RPI and will only compound matters." UNISON has written to UCEA to begin the national dispute resolution procedure.

Branch consultations will follow, recommending members reject the offer and move to an industrial action ballot. UNISON may take industrial action depending on outcome of an this ballot and it will be recommended that UNISON members vote in favour. You have until 1 July 2016 to respond. You should have received an email with details the voting mechanism, if you have not received it or do not have access to email contact a member of the team.§

The NHS Blood and Transplant service needs new donors to come forward to provide the right mix of blood to match patients' needs and replace those who can't donate any more.

The service is particularly looking for new donors who are young, Black and/or of South Asian family origin to reflect the changes in demand from hospitals and make sure that patients have access to the blood they need, when they need it.
