The Royal Society have published a discussion paper on Mathematical Futures in which they share the evidence they have gathered about Mathematics and Data Education in schools over the next 20 years. Key themes look at how maths intersects with statistics, data science and computing; inequalities between pupils; the role of technology in the classroom; and implications for the teaching workforce.
